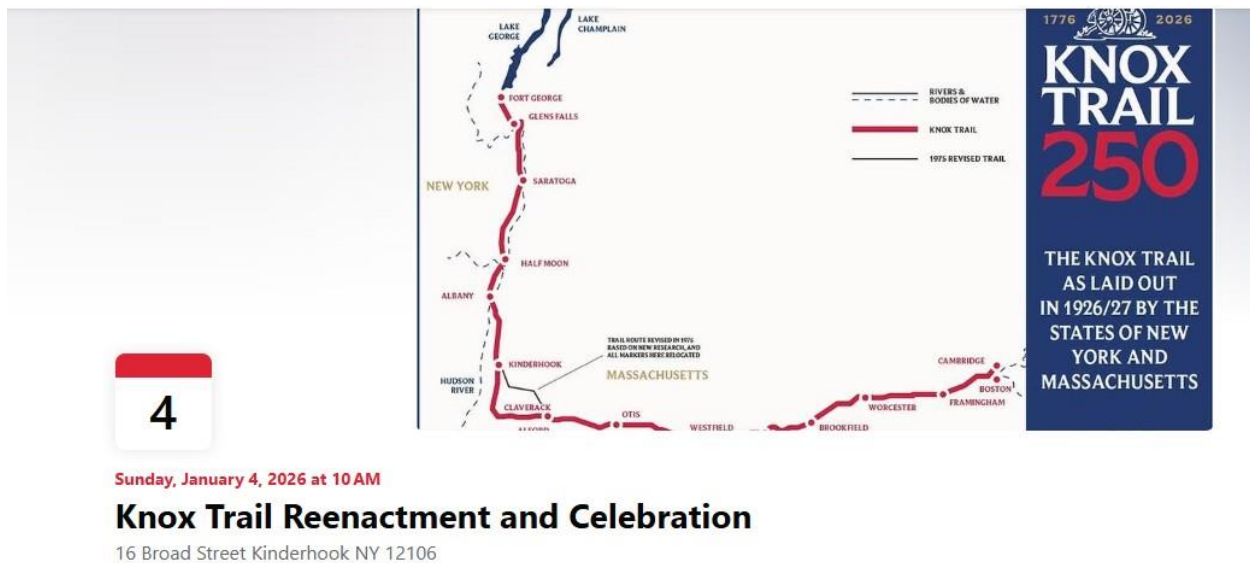


## Knox Noble Cannon Train Reenactment Schedule for Columbia County

**Jan. 4th, 10 AM Vanderpoel House. Town of Kinderhook commemorates the Knox Train of Artillery.**

**Jan. 4th, 4 PM to 5:30 PM Vanderpoel House. The Columbia County Historical Society and Columbia County Historians will amaze and amuse you with a talk and trivia about Knox and the perils of dragging cannons and munitions by oxen and horse across the freezing and treacherous landscape of New York and Massachusetts.**

**Sometime between Jan. 4th-9th Gregg Berninger runs the Ghent portion of the Knox Trail.** Greg welcomes anyone who is able to make the run with him.



**January 8 – Gary Leveille, Author and Reporter:** Gary will present a talk at Kinderhook Library about General Knox’s historic feat from 5:30 pm - 6:30 pm.

**January 9 – James Vanderpoel House of History, 16 Broad Street, Kinderhook Village at 10:00 a.m.** This special tribute to American history will feature reenactors from Fort Ticonderoga, live oxen, special guest speakers, and refreshments – all under a heated tent.

**Jan. 10th, 11:30 AM at the Hillsdale Firehouse.** This commemoration at the Hillsdale Firehouse, 9387 State Route 22 features free food and drinks, and a special Knox Ball Crunch ice cream donated by Stewart’s Shops. The celebration will include costumed reenactors from Fort Ticonderoga and a team of live oxen, replicating the historic effort to transport 60 tons of cannon and munitions from Fort Ticonderoga to Boston in the dead of winter.
